Dirk Lucas Johannes van de Ruit (Sirius)'s question was answered.

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Niels (Newton) was wondering if people agree if there was a better way to do this for the study tours and generalise it. Niels (Newton) asks concept: where do you think these additional hours come from?

Floris-Luc (ConcepT): we do have 10 EC study tour, the educational programme is fully developed by the study trip committee itself and not teachers or smt, it is fully developed by us. Lot 105 of contracts, around 20 companies in total. I think that's where those differences come from.

Niels (Newton): What do you think takes the most time, finding these companies or making contact with them?

Floris-Luc (ConcepT): I think finding contracts takes time but also keeping contact with them, for example when the company doesn't really respond.

Niels (Newton): Even though we only had 13 contract researches, a lot of effort was put into finding more. So you kind of contradict yourself by saying finding takes a lot of time because that would mean our hours we more valid.

Floris-Luc (ConcepT): That would of course assume that if we mail 20 al 20 respond yes, but that was also not the case for us

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Niels (Newton): Alright, I think its good enough, the ABC checked it as well so it should be good.

Roan (OSb): Do any other study associations have a remark on this?

Roan (OSb): We move on to Inter-Actief's Kick-it.

Sam (Arago): i was wondering where the extra hours for their kick in come from, they have a lot more hours than most other kick in committees.

Daniel (Inter-Actief): I wasn't planned to be in this meeting, thijs is ill so I am not quite prepared for all these questions. What I heard at least was that the effort for setting up the camp this 125 year was quite a bit extra. Other than that I don't have much extra prepared.

Sam (Arago): you say extra work but in what sense was it extra work.

Roan (OSb): Lets pull up the proofs.

\*proof for Kick-IT (Inter-Actief) are displayed on screen\*

Sam (Arago): Is there some kind of logbook for it?

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Daniel (Inter-Actief): I'm not sure, I'm not sure what part would be relevant.

Sam (Arago): Let's scroll through it a bit.

Jelle (OSb): There is only the budget and schedule for the Kick-IT, nothing more.

Sam (Arago): If its only this then I find it difficult to see the difference, because our proofs look a lot like this.

Niels (Newton): Then I think it's simple, this was handed in, the ABC did not approve this, ABC requested for more proofs but didn't get it. So these hours should be reduced, right?

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Melle (ABC): That wasn't true. As a part of the ABC committee everything in this document has been approved by the ABC. I believe we might have gotten some more proof in our mail box.

Roan (OSb): Yes there's a year planning in the mail.

\*year planning of the Kick-IT committee is put on the screen from ABC email\*

Melle (ABC): That was not the correct document. Apparently we found the claims substantiated in the end. We looked at hours from last year and the hours this year was actually less than last year so we accepted it, also as IA is pretty big. Conclusion: the reason is that the hours are less than last year and IA is big.

Roan (OSb): If the GMA doesn't agree with this sentiment then we can change this.

Nathan Roussel (Scintilla): Inter-Actief is one of the top 3 biggest camps on campus. If you look at the hours of Paradox then the hours of Inter-Actief isn't actually that impressive as they're similar sizes.

Sjoerd (Alembic): Apart from the fact that there are associations with more hours, I'm confused that the reason it was approved is bc it was less than last year, I don't think that's a good reason.

Jona (Proto): I think its important to consider that IA is really fucking big and goes on a camp that is really fucking big so it makes sense that it's more.

Sam (Arago): Yeah but it is like 50% more. Getting the allocation doesn't depend on the amount of people you have in your camp.

Daniel (Inter-Actief): I know that it was more difficult to get Rutbeek, they were being quite difficult about that and also the municipality was being a lot more difficult with giving out the permits.

Tristan (OSb): As previous board of IA I know a bit more, there was a trouble with getting the budget approved because faculty was having budget cuts, the camp needs a plan for breaking down the camp, work to set up the terrain and more, so it's actually quite a bit of work.

Jasper (Astatine): I looked it up and it seems to be only 9 hours less than last year which is literally almost nothing.

Roan (OSb): That is true, if it is only 9 hours less then it is a bit much. The GMA agreed last year and that was the sentiment we went with. If the GMA doesn't approve this year then we would decrease the hours.

Lex (Stress): This is also Inter-*Actief*'s camp, it is combined kick-in and camp. There were hours in this kick-in as well, organising camp just takes a lot of time.

Job (Arago): Then you don't take into account all the activities that are on campus during kick-in, if you do a faculty kick-in on campus the activities are a lot more elaborate.

Tristan (OSb): You can make the camp as big or small as you want and Inter-Actief value's their camp.

Job (Arago): I don't think you can just add the hours up when there are also faculty activities on campus during the faculty kick-in.

Tristan (OSb): There actually isn't really a faculty kick-in aside from what the Kick-IT committee organises so you can't reason that it is just as well to not have a camp but instead use the faculty activities.

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Sam (Arago): I don't really agree with the remark that you can just put the hours together.

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Sasha (Daedalus): I think its fair, it's not a crazy amount of hours more, and if you take into account that its a bigger association and its an external location i think it makes sense that they have some more hours.

Roan (OSb): I suggest we vote on this specific committee, apart from the whole section, and then later vote in the whole section.

Lex (Stress): What happens if we don't agree?

Roan (OSb): Then IA can request a lower amount of hours and see if the GMA agrees with that.

Melle (ABC): The ABC consists of people. They have quite a lot more of experience and at a certain point the proofs aren't quite as clear for other associations. We can make an estimation 190 on the amount of hours. This time we thought it was appropriate. This proposal will be sent to the SU but it first has to be accepted by this GMA. This is an estimation we think is accurate but if you don't agree we can lower it.

Niels (Newton): For the procedural GMA, we think that if we vote on every one of these it will take a very long time. I would just ask if anyone has a proposal to change this and to otherwise 195 move on.

Roan (OSb): I'm not proposing we go by each request, just the contested ones.

Niels (Newton): Yeah I mean we can just see if someone has a proposal and if not move on.

Roan (OSb): Does anyone have a suggest to lower the amount or can we just move on?

\*moves on, no one asked for a change\*

Roan (OSb): Inter-Actief symposium.

\*Dirk had a comment but was fine\*

Roan (OSb):Inter-Actief Study tour.

Niels (Newton): First of all I'd like to see the logbook, this also brings me to my point to study tours in general. All of the study tours are in the MUST committee and they're all really high, 205 if the ABC thinks its a valid amount of hours then I believe them, but all the chairs should critically think about whether the committee is really doing that amount of hours. If you have a committee with really high hours, please rethink if that is actual a good amount of hours. Because now we will run out of grants by the time we reach the SHOULD category.

Roan (OSb): Daniel?

Daniel (Inter-Actief): Uhhhh...

Tristan (OSb): I believe they do have one, maybe it is still in the email?

Roan (OSb): Yeah Thijs has a logbook, I asked Daniel: do you want to show the logbook?

Daniel (Inter-Actief): yes.

\*logbook is shown\*

Niels (Newton): I also find this difficult because you didn't send this in but Thijs did, if I look at this logbook some things stick out, like one week one person spends 15 hours which is a lot but it's not shown what it is spent on anywhere. I kind of wanna do a proposal for this and study tours in general. Especially now since we have less FOBOS I think it might be good to

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220 cap all study tours that go over 2500 hours, so that we can assure all of our committees get FOBOS this year.

Sjoerd (Alembic): I agree with some things you said, but it's also not really fair to just not count hours any more.

Niels (Newton): I am also really, I find it very difficult to decide on this myself. There has to be some line somewhere, of course you deserve FOBOS for the hours you made, but that is also why we have these proofs for the hours you did make. I think some people see FOBOS differently, as if it is an hourly rate for the hours you made. Actually it is money for the ECs that you lost for the work you did for your association.

Sjoerd (Alembic): I do agree, I also think there is some revision that could be done here like 230 more elaboration on what the hours are for.

Sasha (Daedalus): We are having generally more difficulty over the FOBOS, we're having an investigation into the study tour. It goes away from the Study Tour, it goes on top of the committee. The study tour shouldn't be this big if it is taking that much time from your studies. It is kind of getting unreasonable for some stuff. It shouldn't be this big if it is taking so many hours away from your studies.

Roan (OSb): Is this something that other associations also notice with the study tour that the work load keeps increasing? Because then we can maybe do a foCOS session on that.

\*Patrick (Abacus) nods\*

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Roan (OSb): Okay, we will see if we can do a foCOS session on that.

Sam (Arago): I have another remark. Does the OSFM require you specify what you spend your time on. The study tour are usually where you request the most amount of hours. These hours could only be meetings. So maybe it should require more details on that.

Roan (OSb): Currently nothing in the OSFM requires associations to put in a logbook.

Niels (Newton): We only know you need a logbook for the hours due to the GMA, there is nothing in the OSFM.

Roan (OSb): We are working on it and seeing if we can make logbooks a requirement in the OSFM. We would like to see who did how many hours on what.

Jona (Proto): About the 2500 hour cap that was proposed. So maybe a proposal can be made where instead of saying there is a cap per committee there can be a cap for all study tour committees, if the cap is reached then all the hours are multiplied so that the ratio stays the same. Put a multiplier on every committees hours to make it match proportionally.

Bart (Dimensie): I am not sure how this will be fair.

Tristan (OSb): As an example Stress has a yearly study tour while others have it every few years, as well as that some are bigger than others so you will have inequalities regardless with this proposition.

Nathan Roussel (Scintilla): I think this is way bigger than this part of the GMA should be. I think we should have a proposition in general for the study tours. This proposition would be for the next FOBOS GMA anyway so I think we shouldn't spend so much time on this right now.

Niels (Newton): Why would it not apply to this GMA? I'm saying this so all committees get FOBOS. So I want it to apply now. We do a cap now and then maybe for next time we can make changes to the OSFM. I really want something to change now.

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OS

Nathan Roussel (Scintilla): I think a small cap right now is reasonable, I think coming up with some really complicated formula is too hard for this GMA. So Jona's idea no, but Niels' idea yes.

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Roan (OSb): So you're saying that Jona's proposition is too complicated so far but Niels' not. Jona (Proto): Yes.

Jasper (Astatine): Instead of a hardcap at 2500 hours have a spillover bucket. These hours have been made and it is still rough to punish them.

Roan (OSb): So we don't know how many grants are for this category, we only think there will 270 be too little due to what SU said. Merijn, can you maybe say more about this?

Merijn (SU): The thing is, for 2024 the budget is already made and we have a certain amount of grants, but for 2025 the grants are not set yet. We are already talking about the grants for 2025, so I said to the UT that we cannot reduce the amount of grants for 2025 any more, so for this year it should be decent, but for next year it will be less.

Merijn (SU): On the other hand you never know when the cut-off is going to be. It could also be that we could only pay the boards. There is so much space for deviation that while you should be critical, a few hundred hours isn't going to make that much difference.

Sjoerd (Alembic): If that is the case then the idea that Jasper thought of is actually pretty good. If the money is there than you give them money for all the hours they did.

Roan (OSb): Is that possible Merijn?

Merijn (SU): That is up to the umbrella's. Merijn (SU): I would say personally process wise that this is possible, but maybe then Roan (OSb) for you it is wise to see if you want to do a similar thing for other things. If OS does it but the others don't then you get fucked over.

Roan (OSb): So the conclusion is: OS will discuss with other umbrella's whether Jasper's 285 proposal is a good one.

Jasper (Astatine): 2500 hours cap with spill over so that the hours trickle down to the committees but if there are grants left over then the remaining hours are filled.

Roan (OSb): I think for now we should stop this discussion and maybe continue after. Let's not vote for it now as it is to general.

Niels (Newton): If people want to discuss more they can abstain, if they agree then we can cap it at 2500.

Floris-Luc (ConcepT): I do not think 2500 cap is a good idea, we have MUST and SHOULD and COULD for a reason, it is important that MUST committees get their compensation.

Jasper (Astatine): Yes I agree that if these committees get bloated then they drop immensely 295 in value for the association. That they try to do far more than necessary.

Nathan Roussel (Scintilla): what i understand now is that you do 2500 hours of MUST work and if you exceed that it doesn't apply to that category.

Roan (OSb): I think we should call up a vote to see if people agree with the current amount of hours, if people do not agree with that then move on to Niels to see if we want to make it 300 2500 hours. we were going to have a discussion about jaspers proposal later because it is more general. Anyone got comments on this voting?

Roan (OSb): For the second vote if you abstain it means you want to discuss the proposal more.

Roan (OSb): Then we open the discussion again. For the people that abstained, what do you want to discuss?

310 Melle (ABC): We have a category division. If we want to put a cap on the MUST I think you should not do that for this one. Since the hours are already put in. Study tours do take a lot of hours and I would recommend voting in favour and if any proposal for capping it is to be approved, use it next time.

Daniel (Proto): Two points, I want to clarify that the hours that we have requested are not guaranteed from the SU, right?

Roan (OSb): Yep, it is still dependent on grants.

Daniel (Proto): The reason we abstained was that there was not enough evidence. Having a detailed logbook could be worth it.

Floris-Luc (ConcepT): We can just accept for a less amount of hours. We can cap it at 2500 for them.

Nathan Roussel (Scintilla): The ABC has more information than we do and the agreed, I would say that only applying that rule to IA is for fair. Nathan Roussel (Scintilla): This is a decrease of nearly a thousand hours, that is not small.

Bart (Dimensie): Right now, and also with the proposal we just had we are not having this discussion on study tours in general but IA specifically. I think it's nicer to vote on the proposal of a cap first and then vote for IA. Why vote on IA first and then on the cap?

Roan (OSb): What do other people think about that?

Sam (Arago): The case with this study tour is that it has a 1000 hours more than the next hours. I don't agree we should cap it to 2500 hours but their logbook isn't substantiated for these amount of hours.

Sasha (Daedalus): They deserve more hours but seen the limit of FOBOS, even though Inter-Actief had put in more work, cap it at 3000 or 3500. Put some kind of cap on it, but not too low. Inter-Actief is big.

Roan (OSb): Do we still want to move the cap to 2500 hours?

335 Bart (Dimensie): Yeah let's do a cap first and then IA individually.

Roan (OSb): The proposal is to put a cap on all study tours of 2500 and as soon as we have more grants leftover from other committees, we can give that to study tours.

Roan (OSb): Do people agree with the 2500?

Sasha (Daedalus): I feel like that if we are seeing realistic hours here that a lot of the associations are going over 2500. So 3000 might be more reasonable because the associations can stay below it.

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Niels (Newton): Such a small difference won't make a difference for the smaller committees.

Roan (OSb): Does anyone want a final word on that?

Patrick (Abacus): A big problem wise is the logbook. Every study trip has to fill in a logbook but the more elaborate the logbook is, the better, if the logbook is really good then why cap it? 345

Tristan (OSb): Every study tour fills in their own logbook and it is their own responsibility to update it and keep it properly representative of their hours.

Patrick (Abacus): if you have a really detailed logbook and we think it is realistic, should the committee then still be capped?

Floris-Luc (ConcepT): I think it shouldn't be capped. For Inter-*Actief* the biggest problem is 350 the logbook, but for example our logbook is very detailed and we can show exactly what was done with the hours.

Sam (Arago): It should be demanded by the OSFM that you keep up a logbook and that you are rewarded for those hours and that you aren't capped.

Roan (OSb): Yeah we are working on putting logbooks as a requirement in the OSFM.

Jasper (Astatine): Wouldn't it be nice to have an template for a logbook by OS?

Roan (OSb): That was my plan as well.

Dirk Lucas Johannes van de Ruit (Sirius): Just have everything that is strictly necessary.

Roan (OSb): So you are saying to split up study tours from MUST, SHOULD and COULD?

Dirk Lucas Johannes van de Ruit (Sirius): Yeah that's why i think 2500 is a good cap, 2500 is 360 the amount of hours you really should put into a study tour, so those are essential hours, and then if you decide to spent more time then you can have more money if there is money leftover.

Melle (ABC): the problem now lies with Inter-Actief and the consensus is that they did not hand in a proper logbook. So I propose to lower their amount to let's say to 3000? I do not agree with your proposal. Melle (ABC): I would just lower the amount of hours that Inter-Actief 365 gets and then continue.

Dirk Lucas Johannes van de Ruit (Sirius): I am saying that if you have let's say 2500 hours that must be used to put up a basic study tour, than all the extra hours could be viewed differently.

Tristan (OSb): It's very circumstantial how many hours it takes to organise a study tour. So you should take that into account. For some studies and tours its easier than others.

Floris-Luc (ConcepT): \*basically what Tristan said\* There is a lot of variance between study tours.

Roan (OSb): I propose that there should be a cap for study tours at 2500 hours and if it is clear to OS that there are more grants available that it is given to the study tours for their requested amount.



Sam (Arago): So for committees under 1000 hours you don't need to hold a logbook but more of an estimation.

Roan (OSb): It is all to ensure the ABC knows what they need to consider for a fair division.

Bart (Dimensie): Does that mean that for committees that are ¡1000 hours that if they kept a logbook but didn't clearly write what it all was for then that is fine?
