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6 Presentation SACC

5 Veerle (SU): Hi I am Veerle. I have brought two guests, Carmen and Magdalena. One point of the student union is to make everything know for student wellbeing more available to all students.

Carmen: I'm the head of student coaching and counselling, as of January we get a new name. We have student psychologists, career counselling, [2 more]. For you as boards it's good to know the options you have when you need help. We made this whole visual so that every student can see based on their question what is best for [me].

Carmen: We see a lot of students and maybe you read a lot in news papers and social media, that a lot of people suffer from mental problems. In case your study is affected by your problems, could be mental, financial or health problems. We all experience them and we want to make sure that in reasonable boundaries that we help you to continue your studies with a minimum of study delay.

Carmen: Please know that mental health is a big part of our services, but also for example legal affairs. If there are unsafe situations in your study, this can be very difficult also for boards to deal with. Most boards doubt about what you can do and how to manage these things. We don't offer management courses for that but we do have confidential advisors that can help.

Carmen: They will not be a mediator because they do not mediate. There might be some health options if it is quite extreme. So they expect you to fix it yourself but they can give some advise. It is important to know that if you notice or see students that might not feel that good, how you address that. How you deal with that. I feel it is important that as board members, once in a while you discuss such things. You are in a peer to peer network.

Carmen: We also have students, the CCPs, that is the most easy level for you to approach. If people dont feel okay, send them to a CCP, they are trained for these kinds of situations. Magdalena and I together with veerle are part of the social safety network, we look for an inclusive and safe environment here at the university to make it a nice experience for everyone. If you have a certain theme within your association or board, please feel free to contact us and address things. Veerle is also a representative of the students.

Carmen: The posters will be given to everybody, i hope you periodically address this with everyone: are we okay, are our students okay?

Veerle (SU): it is also an interacting map, the QR code sends you to the online map where you can click on things and it sends you to the website. That can be very useful for you or for members if they need any help. It is a thing that the UT offers so it is good that people are aware that they can use it.

Magdalena (CES): I am a program manager for SWIP, we try to, together with everyone, a lot of different parties, we try to improve the wellbeing of students. We have four areas that we focus on. We do a lot of different things, such as lifestyle things for example. if you are interested in what we do or you have idea, please contact me. we have resources to try things out. We would love more cooperation with students. Conclusion: message me with ideas.

Veerle (SU): Something we did with SWIP is a student living room in the vrijhof and there are walk in hours for student psychologists. The room is not on the map. There is also the look after your friend training that you can go to as a board.

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7 Presentation UReka

Guus (UReka): Hello everyone I am part of the university council. Last year I was in the concept board, officer of educational affairs.

Guus (UReka): We as a student section represent the voice of all the students of the UT. *shows picture* This is pretty much the structure of the university. Most of you probably know the 110 faculty councils. The point is staying in contact will all levels so that we know what is going on. So that through the faculty councils we can talk to the executive board.

Guus (UReka): We have direct communication with the executive board.

Guus (UReka): The composition has the following: There are 9 employees and most of them have been there for a couple of years. The chairman has been there for 20 years. Then there 115 are 9 student seats, 6 UReka and 3 DAS. The university councill works in cycles. We get all the documents, we read all the documents. We discuss what we think of all hte documents and send the documents to the external committee, that was today. Then it goes back to OOS so we can make a decision. Some documents come for advice. Three types of decisions: consent, initiative and advice.

Guus (UReka): They kicked out the quality assurance committees and that is something UReka would like to change. There are three committees, OOS, FPB and SI. OOS is mostly for overall student stuff, this is where students are most important. FPB is finance and employee affairs. SI is for internationalisation.
